From Rt. 290: Take exit 6B onto Rt.20 West Rt 20 W will take you to Rt. 56 North Go Right onto Rt. 56 for one mile. Turn left onto Pleasant Street.

From the Rhode Island Area: Take Rt. 146 North to Rt. 20 West Rt 20 West will take you to Rt. 56 North Go right onto Rt. 56 for one mile, Turn left onto Pleasant Street.

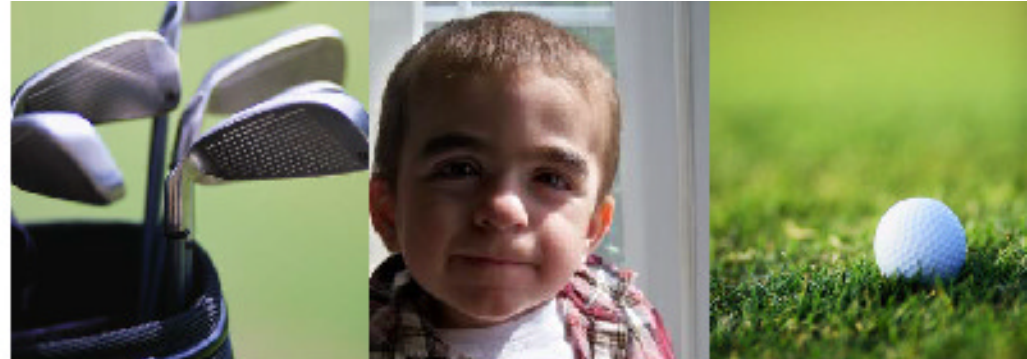

Bryce's Fight

Bryce is a happy, life loving 5 year old boy who always gets up with a smile. He continues to fight through his many challenges while gaining what skills he can each day. He loves sports, cars and the outdoors.

MPS III A. Sanfilippo Syndrome is what Bryce has. It is a recessive genetic disorder. Children with MPS III A are missing an enzyme that breaks down strings of a complex body sugar called heparan sulfate. These are naturally used by the body to build connective tissue.

The partially broken down sugar that is left over attaches itself to cells in the body damaging them and in time will accumulate in the brain and other vital organs causing severe progressive damage.

Children with Sanfilippo often appear normal at birth and will develop normally for the first year or two, but as more cells become damaged symptoms begin to appear.

Eventually the buildup causes hyperactivity, hearing loss, sleep disorders, loss of speech, loss of mental and physical stability, dementia, seizures and finally death. Most of the symptoms arise by the age of 6 with life expectancy of 10 years old.

Bryce received a cord blood stem cell transplant in September of 2006 at Duke in NC. Though it is *not a cure* it may slow down the progression of the disorder and help Bryce live a better quality of life. He also suffered a pulmonary hemorrhage at age 2 from a reaction to general anesthesia during a routine MRI which took his skills back to birth to relearn them once again.

Bryce also has Hashimoto's Hypothyroidism and Adrenal Insufficiencies also known as secondary Addison's Disease. Where Bryce's body does not produce it's own cortisol. Cortisol is necessary for our bodies to react to any stressful situation it is what boosts our adrenalin into action when we get ill or hurt. Bryce takes life long meds for these conditions. Another issue that Bryce has is his lenses of both of his eyes are dislocating. At his age the lenses cannot be replaced but they can be removed in order to sustain his eyesight longer.

Bryce is scheduled in September at Duke to have his first of two eye surgeries.
